16-10 AGGRAVATED BATTERY BY SHOOTING

NARRATIVE

ON TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 6, 2018, AT 1:24 AM, OFFICER LAWRENCE JONES UNIT 123C OF THE FIRST DISTRICT RECEIVED A CALL VIA NEW ORLEANS POLICE DEPARTMENT'S DISPATCHER OF A SIGNAL 94, ILLEGAL DISCHARGE OF FIREARM IN THE 1900 BLOCK OF BIENVILLE STREET. THE SIGNAL WAS LATER CHANGE TO A 34S, AGGRAVATED BATTERY BY SHOOTING. A SECOND CALL FROM DISPATCH ADVISED A MALE SUBJECT WAS ON THE GROUND ASKING FOR HELP.

OFFICER JONES ARRIVED ON SCENE AND OBSERVED MALE LAYING ON HIS BACK ON THE GROUND BLEED FROM AN UNKNOWN PORTION OF HIS BODY. OFFICER JONES THEN OBSERVED A BLACK MOUNTAIN BIKE ON THE OPPOSITE SIDE OF THE STREET FROM THE MALES BODY NEAR THE BUSINESS OF 2205 BIENVILLE. THE BICYCLE WAS COVERED IN BLOOD ALONG THE RIGHT SIDE OF THE BIKE.

OFFICER JONES OBSERVED A BLOOD TRAIL LEADING FROM THE VICTIM'S BODY INTO THE 300 BLOCK OF N. GALVEZ STREET, TO THE 2100 AND 2000 BLOCK OF CONTI STREET, INTO THE 300 BLOCK OF N. PRIEUR STREET AND THE TRAIL LEAD BACK TO THE 1900 BLOCK OF BIENVILLE STREET. WHILE IN THE 1900 BLOCK OF BIENVILLE STREET, OFFICERS LOCATED A SPENT BULLET FRAGMENT ALONG THE GRASSY AREA OF THE 1900 BLOCK OF BIENVILLE STREET NEAR THE INTERSECTION OF BIENVILLE AND N. PRIEUR STREET.

OFFICER JONES OBSERVED IN THE 2000 BLOCK OF BIENVILLE STREET A TRAFFIC CAMERA, WHICH AIMED IN THE DIRECTION OF THE 1900 BLOCK OF BIENVILLE STREET. ALSO OBSERVED ON THE BUILDING OF 2205 BIENVILLE STREET BUSINESS OF CACAMO AUTO REPAIR SERVICE.

OFFICER JONES REQUESTED THE ASSISTANCE OF DISTRICT SERGEANT, DISTRICT INVESTIGATION UNIT, CRIME LAB, AND EMS.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE UNIT 3235 ARRIVED ON SCENE AND ADMINISTERED AID TO THE VICTIM. THE EMS UNIT LATER TRANSPORTED THE VICTIM UP TO UNIVERSITE HOSPITAL FOR FURTHER TREATMENT.

SGT. M. MORRISON UNIT 120 C OF THE FIRST DISTRICT ARRIVED ON SCENE.

DISTRICT INVESTIGATIVE UNIT DETECTIVE M. CONSTANTINE UNIT 1138 ARRIVED ON SCENE.

CRIME LAB UNIT 5123 ARRIVED ON SCENE PHOTOGRAPH EVIDENCE, DNA SWABBED EVIDENCE AND COLLECTED A HAT AND A BULLET FRAGMENT FROM THE 1900 BLOCK OF BIENVILLE STREET.

OFFICER'S BODY AND VIDEO CAMERA WAS ACTIVATED DURING INCIDENT.
