



The study was conducted for CNN via telephone by SSRS, an independent research company. Callback interviews were conducted from November 08 to November 12, 2018 among a sample of **677** respondents who were originally interviewed from November 01 to November 03, 2018 prior to the midterm elections. The landline total respondents were 305 and there were 372 cell phone respondents. The margin of sampling error for total respondents is +/-5.0 at the 95% confidence level and for results among the **619** registered voters it is +/-5.2. The design effect is 1.74. 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MORE ON METHODOLOGY

A total of 677 adults were interviewed by telephone nationwide by live interviewers calling both landline and cell phones. Adults for this poll were previously interviewed prior to the 2018 midterm elections. Interviews were conducted in English and Spanish. Among the entire reinterviewed sample, 39% described themselves as Democrats, 25% described themselves as Republicans, and 36% described themselves as independents or members of another party.

All respondents in the original survey were asked questions concerning basic demographics, and the entire original sample was weighted to reflect national Census figures for gender, race, age, education, region of country, and telephone usage. The post-election survey data were weighted to reflect the weighting that was done for the original Pre-Election data, and to account for systematic callback nonresponse along known population parameters and calibration variables.

Results for the full sample have a margin of sampling error of +/- 5.0 percentage points. For the sample of 619 registered voters, it is +/- 5.2 percentage points.

Crosstabs on the following pages only include results for subgroups with enough unweighted cases to produce a sampling error of +/-8.5 percentage points or less once adjusted for design effect. Some subgroups represent too small a share of the national population to produce crosstabs with an acceptable sampling error. Interviews were conducted among these subgroups, but results for groups with a design-effect adjusted sampling error larger than +/-8.5 percentage points are not displayed and instead are denoted with "N/A".
