



The study was conducted for CNN via telephone by SSRS, an independent research company. Interviews were conducted from January 30 to February 02, 2019 among a sample of 1,011 respondents. The landline total respondents were 388 and there were 623 cell phone respondents. The margin of sampling error for total respondents is +/- 3.8 at the 95% confidence level. The design effect is 1.52. More information about SSRS can be obtained by visiting www.ssrs.com. Unless otherwise noted, results beginning with the March 31-April 2, 2006 survey and ending with the April 22-25, 2017 survey are from surveys conducted by ORC International. Results before March 31, 2006 are from surveys conducted by Gallup.

MORE ON METHODOLOGY

A total of **1,011** adults were interviewed by telephone nationwide by live interviewers calling both landline and cell phones. Interviews were conducted in English and Spanish. Among the entire sample, **32**% described themselves as Democrats, **25**% described themselves as Republicans, and **43**% described themselves as independents or members of another party.

All respondents were asked questions concerning basic demographics, and the entire sample was weighted to reflect national Census figures for gender, race, age, education, region of country, and telephone usage.

Results for the full sample have a margin of sampling error of +/- 3.8 percentage points.

Crosstabs on the following pages only include results for subgroups with a minimum n=125 unweighted cases. While interviews were conducted among a representative sample of the adult population of the United States, results for subgroups with fewer than n=125 unweighted cases are not displayed and instead are denoted with "N/A" because they are too small to be projectable to their true values in the population.
