Interviews were conducted from **March 25 to March 26, 2019** among a sample of **701** respondents. The margin of sampling error for total respondents is +/- **5.4** at the 95% confidence level. MORE ON METHODOLOGY

A total of **701** adults were interviewed online through the SSRS Opinion Panel, a nationally representative panel of U.S. adults age 18 or older recruited using probability-based sampling techniques. Interviews were conducted in English. Among the entire sample, **32%** described themselves as Democrats, **26%** described themselves as Republicans, and **42%** described themselves as independents or members of another party.

The entire sample was weighted to reflect national Census figures for gender, race, age, education, region of country, and civic engagement.

Results for the full sample have a margin of sampling error of +/- 5.4 percentage points.

Crosstabs on the following pages only include results for subgroups with a minimum n=125 unweighted cases. While interviews were conducted among a representative sample of the adult population of the United States, results for subgroups with fewer than n=125 unweighted cases are not displayed and instead are denoted with "N/A" because they are too small to be projectable to their true values in the population.
