



The study was conducted for CNN via telephone by SSRS, an independent research company. Interviews were conducted from **April 25 to April 28, 2019** among a sample of **1,007** respondents. The landline total respondents were **358** and there were **649** cell phone respondents. The margin of sampling error for total respondents is +/- **3.8** at the 95% confidence level. The design effect is **1.50**. More information about SSRS can be obtained by visiting <u>www.ssrs.com</u>. Unless otherwise noted, results beginning with the March 31-April 2, 2006 survey and ending with the April 22-25, 2017 survey are from surveys conducted by ORC International. Results before March 31, 2006 are from surveys conducted by Gallup.

### MORE ON METHODOLOGY

A total of **1,007** adults were interviewed by telephone nationwide by live interviewers calling both landline and cell phones. Interviews were conducted in English and Spanish. Among the entire sample, **33**% described themselves as Democrats, **26**% described themselves as Republicans, and **41**% described themselves as independents or members of another party.

All respondents were asked questions concerning basic demographics, and the entire sample was weighted to reflect national Census figures for gender, race, age, education, region of country, and telephone usage.

Results for the full sample have a margin of sampling error of +/-3.8 percentage points. For the sample of 913 registered voters it is +/-3.9 percentage points. For the subset of 451 Democrats and Democratic-leaning independents, it is +/-5.7 percentage points. For the subset of 411 Democrats and Democratic-leaning independents who are registered to vote, it is +/-5.9 percentage points.

Crosstabs on the following pages only include results for subgroups with a minimum n=125 unweighted cases. While interviews were conducted among a representative sample of the adult population of the United States, results for subgroups with fewer than n=125 unweighted cases are not displayed and instead are denoted with "N/A" because they are too small to be projectable to their true values in the population.

Random half-samples can result in smaller subgroup sizes which fall below our minimum for publishing crosstabs for those groups. Members of groups not shown in the published crosstabs are fully represented in the results for each question in the poll. Unweighted sample sizes for registered voters under age 45 for each of the hypothetical 2020 matchups ranged from 111 to 127, for non-white voters they ranged from 107 to 130.
