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#### OVERVIEW

The study was conducted for CNN via telephone by SSRS, an independent research company. Interviews were conducted from December 4, 2019 to December 8, 2019 among a sample of **1,205** respondents who live in Texas. The landline total respondents were **421** and there were **784** cell phone respondents. The margin of sampling error for total respondents is +/-3.4 at the 95% confidence level. The design effect is 1.46. For results among the 327 respondents who are likely to vote in the Democratic primary the margin of sampling error is +/-6.6 and for results among the 537 respondents who are likely to vote in the Republican primary it is +/-5.0. #### **MORE ON METHODOLOGY**

A total of **1,205** adults who live in Texas were interviewed by telephone by live interviewers calling both landline and cell phones. Interviews were conducted in English and Spanish. Among the entire sample, 28% described themselves as Democrats, 30% described themselves as Republicans, and 43% described themselves as independents or members of another party.

All respondents were asked questions concerning basic demographics, and the entire sample was weighted to reflect Census figures for gender, race, age, education, state region, and telephone usage.

Results for the full sample have a margin of sampling error of +/- 3.4 percentage points. For the subset of 327 respondents who are likely to vote in the Democratic primary, it is +/- 6.6 percentage points. For the subset of 537 respondents who are likely to vote in the Republican primary, it is +/- 5.0 percentage points.
