### What kind of events?

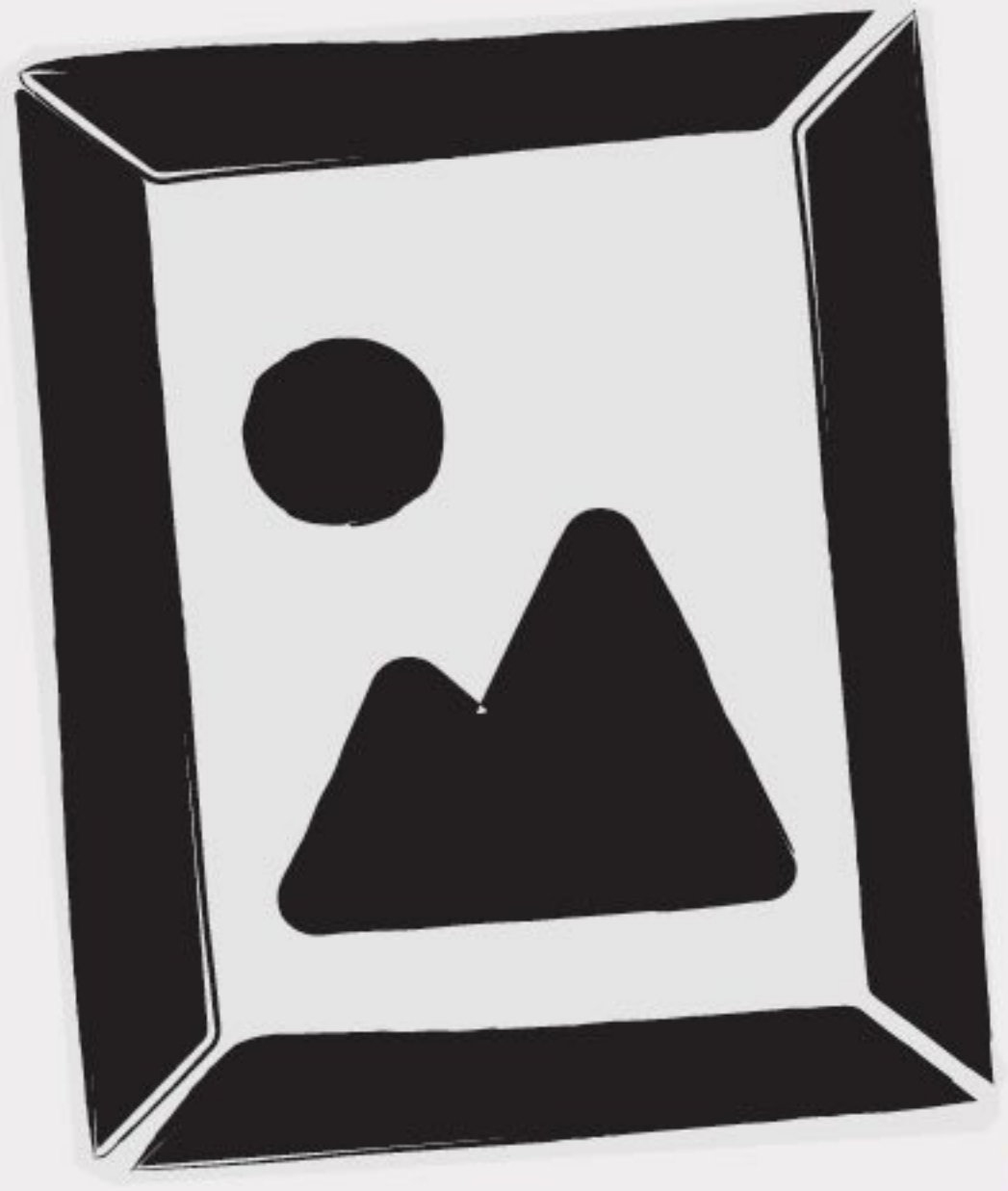
We're encouraging students and teachers to come up with their own ideas, but here are some suggestions for the kind of thing you could do.

CNN is asking students and schools to organize #MyFreedomDay events on March 11, 2020 to highlight modern slavery and celebrate freedom.







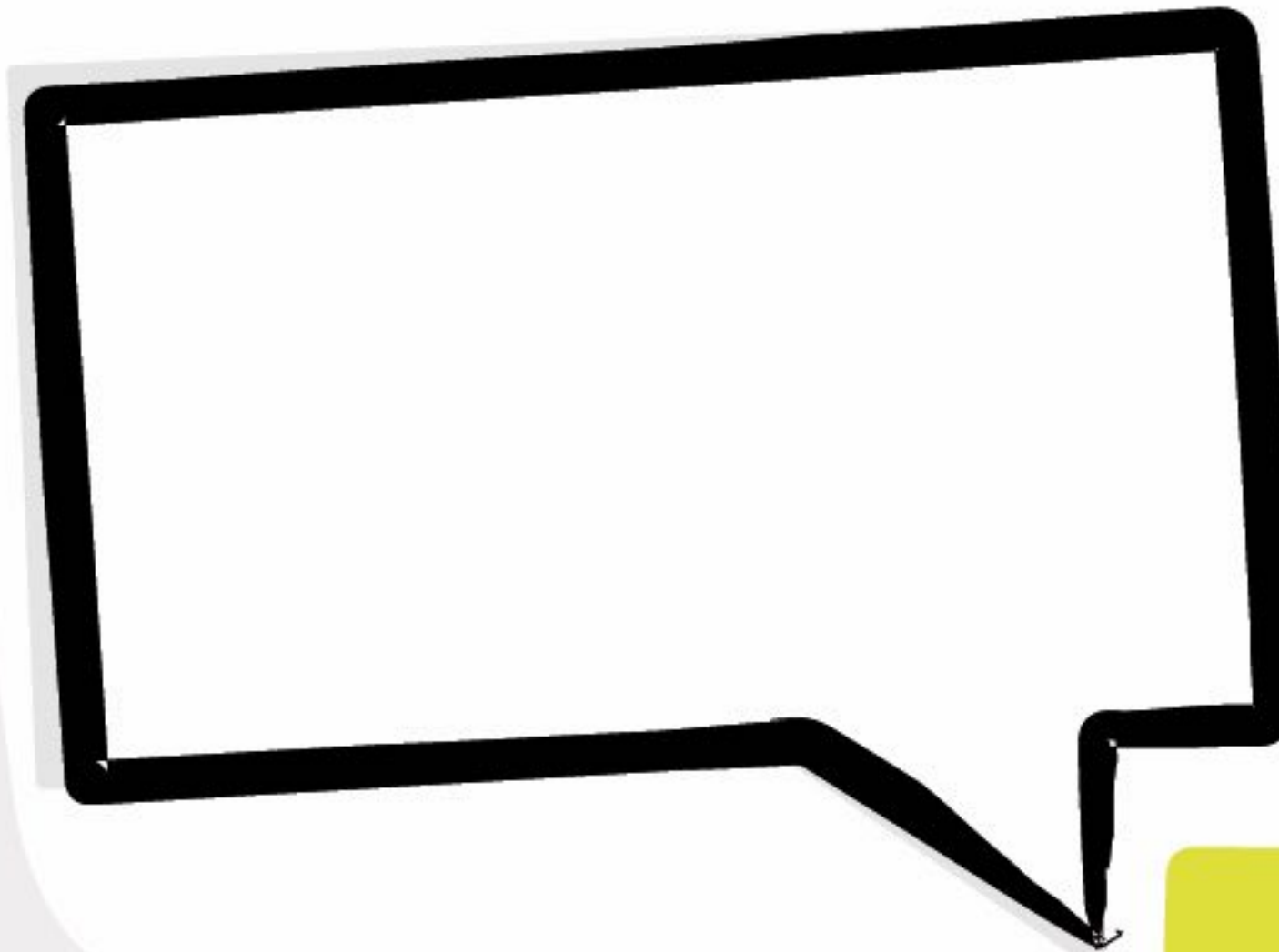
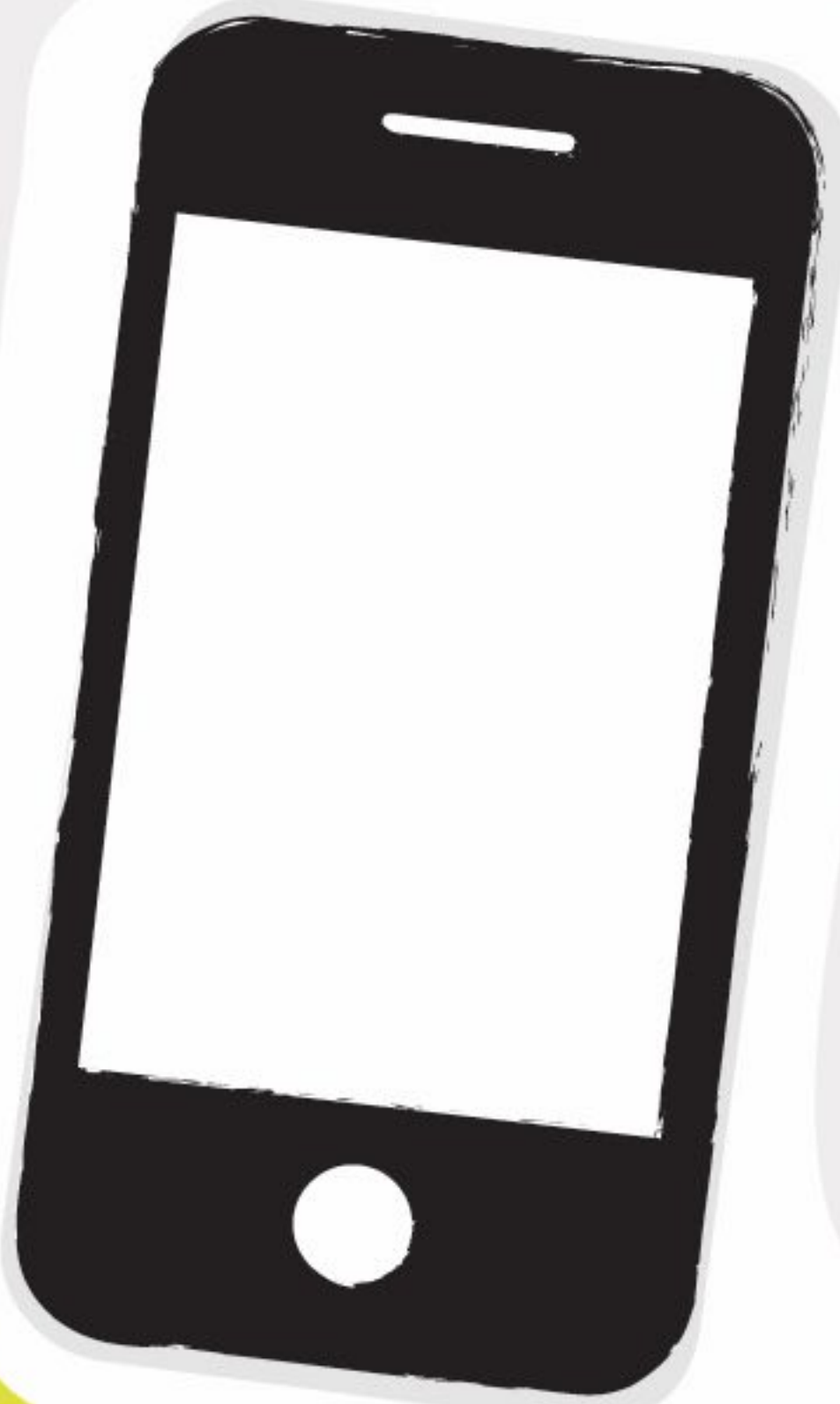
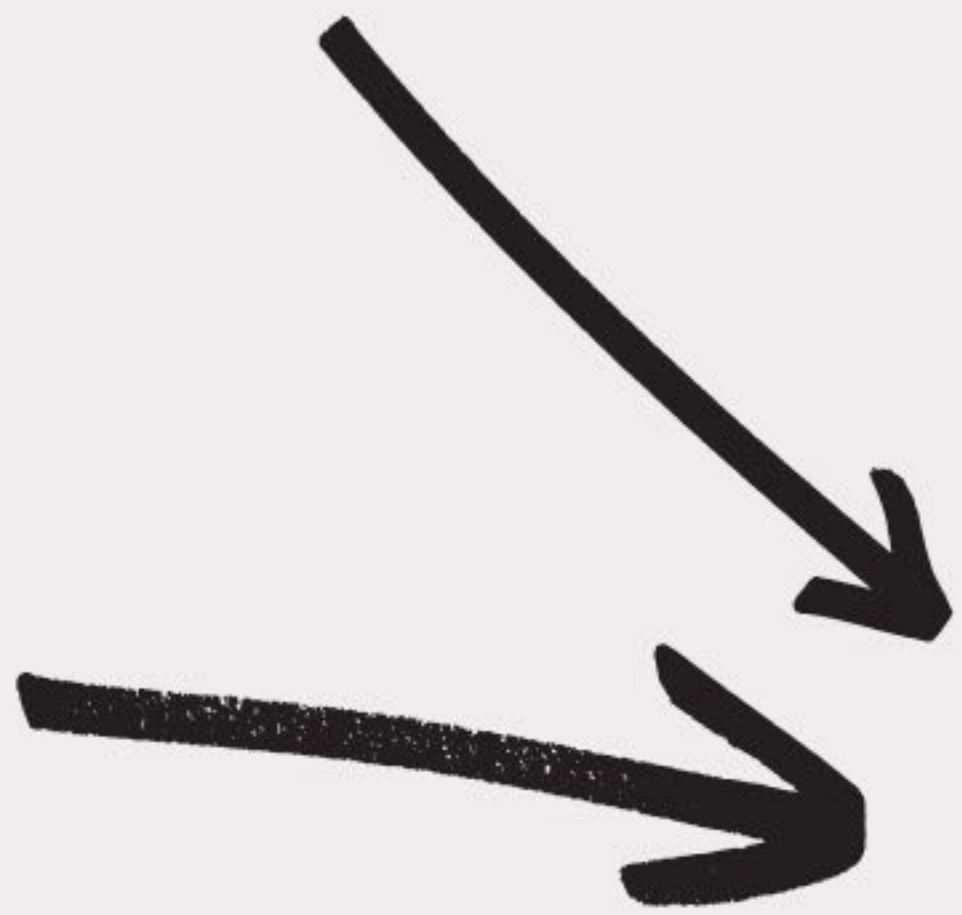
## Art Show
